



## GIS Manager Events and Activities

The Esri User Conference (UC) has many presentations and events with hundreds of topics covered. To help you find your way to the GIS manager, leader and executive sessions and events, we have prepared a more focused agenda.

For simplicity, this document focuses on Esri staff-led sessions and events. You can browse the User Presentations [here](#). First, let's define the different types of sessions and events:

**Preconference Seminars** – Get in-depth, expert-led training on the latest GIS technologies before the conference so you can build upon your new knowledge at UC. **There are some valuable sessions in this group.**

**Related Events** – Take advantage of expert-led training, interactive seminars, and more.

**Technical Workshops** – Led by Esri staff, these 60-minute workshops focus on concepts, best practices, and how the platform and technology work. **Some of these repeat Tuesday through Thursday from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM.**

**Expo Spotlight Talks** – These 20-minute talks in small group settings illuminate what resources are available at the conference. These occur in the San Diego Convention Center (SDCC) Expo Hall.

**Envisioning Center Presentations** – These presentations emulate real workflows and events to show how GIS can redefine a business process using multiple people playing roles involved in the specific activities. **These occur in the SDCC Expo Hall and are valuable to GIS leaders as they help you envision how GIS can spur digital transformation in your organization.**

**Demo Theater Presentations** – Led by Esri staff, these 45-minute technical “how to’s” focus on execution of specific GIS tasks, rather than concepts. These occur in the SDCC Expo Hall.

**Here are some suggested sessions and events for GIS managers, leaders and other executives:**

**GIS Managers' Open Summit (GISMOS)** – The GIS Managers' Open Summit (GISMOS) is an all-day, interactive experience designed for existing, and future, GIS managers/leaders, business and technology strategists, and other decision makers attending the Esri International User Conference. GISMOS is on Tuesday, July 9<sup>th</sup> in the Indigo Ballroom, at the Hilton San Diego Bayfront, adjacent to the SDCC. There is no fee, but registration is required.

The **Implementing ArcGIS Community on GeoNet** – is a public community group to gain tips and advice on implementation best practices, discuss challenging topics, learn from the innovative minds of GIS professionals, share your experiences and stay connected.
